

DDS Academic Year 2023-2024 Projected Cost of Attendance

The School of Dentistry's academic calendar (summer/fall/spring) varies from the University's financial aid calendar (fall/spring/summer). The first year of dental school does not include a summer semester. Students advance to the next academic year after the spring semester. Be aware that financial aid is awarded each summer according to the University's financial aid calendar, meaning that D2 summer aid will be offered in the same aid year as the D1 fall and spring aid, etc. The cost of attendance figures are provided in coordination with SOD Finance and OneStop based on the budgets approved by the University Of Minnesota Board Of Regents. The actual incurred cost of attendance may vary on an individual basis given external and personal factors. Other Considerations	~	International students in the 4-year DDS program pay the non-resident rate and are assessed additional fees by International Student and Scholar Services (ISSS) each semester: International Student Engagement Fee \$14.00; International Student Support Services Fee \$175.00. International students in the Program for Advanced Standing Students (PASS) have a different tuition structure; consult with the PASS office for more information.
	*	Textbooks & General Supplies: The amount of aid offered for textbooks and general supplies is a set amount of \$1,000 per semester. Actual needs may vary by course and semester; amounts listed above include only required textbooks, if purchased at full price from the University Bookstore. Students may check the course syllabus for textbook information. DDS4 students will not be required to purchase any new textbooks. This estimated cost of \$1,000 is intended to help cover the cost of board exams.
	^	Living Expenses: The amounts shown for Room and Board, Transportation, and Personal/Miscellaneous expenses are estimates based on the University's surveys of housing (one-bedroom apartments) in the University area and on government statistics for weekly food consumption, transportation, and personal/miscellaneous expenses. You are not required to accept the full amount of the loan offered to you. It is recommended that you borrow only what is needed for your unique situation, in consideration of any other funding sources and variations in individual living expenses. If students accept too much aid, it is possible to return aid in the same semester by contacting the Office of Student Finance.
	**	Loan Fees: This amount is offered in financial aid packages to offset the cost of loan origination fees. Actual loan fees depend on the loan type and amount of aid accepted.
	^^	<p>Health Insurance Requirement: Students are required to have health insurance coverage, and may submit a Cost of Attendance Appeal to include the cost of health insurance in their financial aid assessment. Students may elect to purchase the University's Student Health Benefit Plan (SHBP) or private insurance. The 2023-2024 rate for SHBP single student coverage is \$1,734 for each semester in Fall and Spring; Summer is included if the student was enrolled in the SHBP the previous spring.</p> <p>Additional Expenses: Additional educational costs not included in the Cost of Attendance estimate may include, for example, uniforms and board exams. Consult the "Explanation of DDS Projected Cost of Attendance" sheet for more information. If needed, a Cost of Attendance Appeal may be submitted to the Graduate and Professional Office of Student Finance if the student finds that the amount of aid does not adequately cover eligible expenses. A Child Care Expense Appeal may also be submitted to the Graduate and Professional Office of Student Finance.</p>
