COMLEX and USMLE Performance

- Class of 2010 final performance
 - COMLEX L1
 - Pass rate: 94.4%
 - National Average: 89.7%
 - Rank in Pass Rate: 7 of 23 COMs
 - Mean Score: 512 (vs. 497)
 - USMLE S1
 - Pass Rate: 85.7% (vs. 93%)
 - Mean Score: 205 (vs. 221)
- Class of 2011 performance (AZCOM only)
 - COMLEX L1
 - Pass rate: 99.6% (est.)
 - Mean Score: 543 (est.)
 - USMLE S1
 - Pass Rate: 89.9%
 - Mean Score: 211
- We start talking about preparing for COMLEX at the start of Q2
 - Kaplan Q-Bank should be available now (until July 15)

Likely Year-End Schedule

Timeline for Regional Match

- November 30, 2009 through December 6, 2009
- Results Friday, December 21, 2009
- Students enter top four choices in ranked order
 - One choice must be outside Urban Arizona Region
- This is for regions, not for specific rotations
 - Rotation spin will occur in Spring, 2010
- We allow Region trades until the Rotation Track lottery begins

Timeline for Track Lottery

- By Region
- Occurs January 4 – 11, 2010
- Results by end of January, 2010
- We allow trading of tracks
 - Must be in the same region
 - Must be entire track, not individual rotation blocks

Timeline for Rotation Lottery

- March 8 – 12, 2010
- Results by end of April, 2010

Please Note!

- Tracks and rotations are our best guess of what your MS3 schedule will look like. Student tracks and rotations are periodically changed due to factors that we (and you) can't predict.
- Some rotations in the Phoenix Urban area are personally scheduled by the Department Chairs. These rotations are not assigned via the lottery.

Core Rotations for MS3

- Family Medicine (8 weeks)
- Internal Medicine (8 weeks)
- Surgery (4 weeks)
- Pediatrics (4 weeks)
- OB-Gyn (4 weeks)
- Cardiology (4 weeks)
- Psychiatry (4 weeks)
- Special Rotations
 - PC (FM, IM, Surg, Peds, OB)
 - Rural (if in a rural region, this is Elective)
 - May be done out-of-region

Core Rotations for MS4

- Critical Care (4 weeks)
- Emergency Medicine (4 weeks)
- Subspecialty Surgery (4 weeks)
- Subspecialty Medicine (4 weeks)
- 28 weeks of Elective Rotations
 - Maximum of 3 rotations (12 weeks) in any one specialty
- All MS4 Rotations may be done out-of-region


