# Unofficial Electives

- You will need a doctor willing to supervise you
- Some provinces will license you for independent electives
  - College of Physicians and Surgeons of BC
- Some universities will license you after you find a preceptor
  - Manitoba, NOSM
- If you cannot get licensed through a regulatory body or approved by a university, you are essentially your preceptor's responsibility
  - Easier to do in a clinic – if in hospital, must also be approved by hospital and/or department
  - Ask anyone and everyone! Work your connections
  - A lot of people will say no and refer you to AFMC/university electives applications. Not helpful when you've already been rejected!
