Two Phase examination - ~ 15 to 20% required to take Phase 2



Phase 1 – June 2020



Give yourself time to take **and receive feedback** prior to scheduling Step 2 CS

Most student will need a month of study
time before taking Step 2 CK

Take the ICEE (and make sure you pass)
before taking Step 2 CS

USMLE Step 2 CS

Standardized patient-based clinical skills examination

Exam information

- 12 SP encounters (15 min) + 12 notes (10 minutes)
- Integrated Clinical Encounter; Communication/Interpersonal; English proficiency
- Graded Pass/Fail; passing required for graduation and for license
- \$1300 5 national centers, including Houston
- Full information and sample videos at www.usmle.org

When should I take it?

- Not before finishing all your Year 3 clerkships
- Not after November 30 (UTMB deadline)
 - After **~August 1** to take advantage feedback on your Year 4 ICEE in ~ June
 - By **~September 12**
 - Provides an October score for residency applications
 - Allows time to retake by December 31 for score in time for rank lists

When should I register and select a date?


- Now; slots fill quickly; waiting lists are maintained by USMLE
- 12-month eligibility window; can reschedule >14 days out without a fee
- Requests for accommodations take substantial time and documentation


Scheduling Step 2 CS

Why?



Improve the structure and rigor of the post-clerkship Career Launch Phase of Curriculum

Improved quality and duration of time in field of interest

Better prepared for internship



Increased time and flexibility for career exploration and residency match



Neuro transition to core-clerkship year



Transition of basic-science phase of curriculum finishing 8 weeks earlier







Early Periods

- AI – Recommendation Letters
- Step 2 Study Periods
- External (Away) Electives
- ERAS Application Due – September 15th



Interview Season – Periods 6, 7, 8, 9 and 10

- 10/12 to 01/22; Period 9 is the Holiday Period - Limited

Post-Match Periods – 14 to 16

- 16 ends May 28th – Graduation, Sat. June 5th, 2021

Post-Core Clerkship Phase: Career Launch 20-21

Increased Flexibility - 16 periods in 4th year (minus 1 set-aside for boot camp)

- 5 clinical rotations (AI, EM, Neuro, 2 clinical electives) in 12 total periods before and now 5 in 15 periods + Boot Camp

Many students will come-in with existing elective credit:

- 4 - require 14 weeks: 4 electives + 2 week
- 8 - require 10 weeks: 3 electives + 1 week
- 12 - require 6 weeks: 2 electives
- 16 - require 2 weeks: 0 electives + 2 weeks

Health Systems Science (HSS) and Community Health Longitudinal Course

Widely considered the “third pillar” of medical education

Flexible, online content + community service component


Online Assignments including modules with quizzes

Time-flexible, in-person assignments

- Match Week: 03/15 to 03/19 - Match Day



Acting Internship - AI

Your Choice of Field

Can Do at an External Site

- Must Have “AI” or “Subinternship” in the Course Name or Description
- Assistant Dean of Educational Affairs – **Dr. Farr may approve in rare, special circumstances**
- Must be in **ADVANCE** of taking for AI credit
- Must have level of responsibility equivalent to an AI


Why Do

- Highly competitive match
- Need specialty-specific LOR
- Want to make sure a good fit
- Stretch program(s)

Why NOT Do

- Not necessary for your field
- Expensive
- Scheduling constraints
- Adjustment to new place

Centralized system for away courses



In Texas, most (but not all) programs participate



Easier and More Timely Process

Can apply online and confirm without delay



Enrollment Services will assist if needed: enrollment.services@utmb.edu

Non-VSAS External Electives



Institutional or Hospital: **B-Form Required**

Need a course description for approval, provide link or attach description to B-Form

If no affiliation agreement in place (legal requirement), **it could take months to set-up**



Community or Private Practice: **Student-Created Elective Form Required**

Typically legal requirements are minimal and quicker to set-up



ALL electives **MUST** be Approved by Elective Course Committee



Plan and Have a Back-up Plan

External (Away) Rotations

- Anywhere with established EM residency program
- At an EM department with a supervising ED physician sponsoring the student
- Not an ambulatory acute care or urgent care facility

EM Away



Best to schedule a UTMB course just in case, can drop it once Away Rotation is Confirmed



If you plan to complete the EM selective at another medical school through **VSAS**

C form must be signed by Dr. Mileski



If you plan to complete the EM selective as **Non-VSAS**

B form must be completed and sent to Enrollment Services

C form must be signed by Dr. Mileski

POM4

POM3 students eligible

POM3 + POM4 = 4 weeks elective credit *or*

POM3 + POM3 project = 4 weeks elective credit



May Be Integrated into Boot

Adding/Dropping Courses

Ongoing throughout the year

Make Sure Alternative Course has Space

BEFORE Dropping

- Keep track of add/drop deadlines - 30 days
- After deadlines, must use a C form
 - Reach out to Course Coordinator / Director
 - Course Director Signature Required
 - **ALWAYS VERIFY YOUR SCHEDULE**

Scheduling Logistics

4th year electives will be open to schedule
February 26th at 5:30 pm

Online through MyStar – Swap Out the Default “Vacation”

Neurology will already be on schedule


Add EM and AI First

Don't drop a course until you have a replacement scheduled

Don't leave things until the last minute - 3rd year and PA students will fill slots

FAQ

What if I do two 4-week clinical electives at an external site for a total of 8 weeks, what happens to the other 2 weeks of credit that is above the requirement for 6 weeks of clinical elective?



You will be able to transfer those 2 weeks of credit to your general elective requirement of 18 weeks.

FAQ

What if I do two Acting Internships?



Anything above the required 3 weeks of Acting Internship will apply to your 6-week Clinical Elective Requirement.

FAQ

What if I only require 1 or 2 credit weeks of elective to meet my 18-week requirement?



We are encouraging faculty to create additional 1 & 2-week elective credit courses that will come online as soon as possible. In the interim, find a 3-week elective to meet your requirements. It is easier to drop than to add at the last minute.


What if I need additional malpractice insurance coverage for an away rotation or a more recent drug screen?
